45 MAMS STUDENTS HELP

THE COMMUNITY IN MONSON MASS



Approximately 45 juniors and seniors from Mass Academy travelled to Monson MA during their vacation on Monday October 17 and Tuesday October 18 to assist in the tornado relief efforts. The students were accompanied by Mass Academy Director Michael Barney, Humanities teacher David Ludt and Mass Academy's College Counselor Lisa Post. Mass Academy students perform community service hours as part of their graduation requirements, but in discussions with student leadership, Mr. Barney suggested that a group project like this would not only provide a way for students to perform service hours, but work together as a school team. The student leadership embraced the idea and the numbers of participants quickly grew, filling the bus to capacity. The community site was chosen because one of our Academy students hails from Monson, and the school felt it was

very appropriate to direct efforts to help the community of a classmate, who is also participating in the effort. Mr. Barney, Academy director comments that "many more students expressed interest in this trip but had already planned out of state college visits during this week, since it is our only vacation time before early action applications are due. I was overwhelmed with the positive response to this project. I am very proud of our students, their willingness to help and their spirit of teamwork". The volunteer coordinators and homeowners who we supported over the two days were very appreciative of our efforts. The team cleared over 3 acres, stacking brush and logs which will be chipped by a crew in the next week, and allow the homeowners to replant new trees and begin to landscape.
