Volunteers

The gatekeepers' meeting is at 8:00 am in the training center. Lunch is available to our volunteers. At the completion of the day, you may acquire the additional voucher.

Coaches' Corner

If a coach is staying only for a few days, his/her replacement will need the departing coach's credential. Please, if you are planning to leave, return the coach credential to the NYSEF race administrator.

We request that clubs keep the coach to athlete ratio at 1:5.

Athlete Conduct

We anticipate that all athletes attending the Championships will be well behaved. Gore Mt. Ski Center is a wonderful host to ski racing and works hard to produce ideal race trail conditions for all of our races. We ask that all athletes, coaches, and parents treat the Gore Mt. personnel and the skiing public politely on the hill and in the lodge.

Our ski patrol requires the use of the safety bar on the chair lifts and requests that racers control their speed on trails. Absolutely no tucking anywhere off the race trail. The patrol is very strict. The lift attendants need to be able to see your lift ticket at all times—even when wearing a speed suit.

Local Lodging/Eateries

There are a number of places within 20 or 30 minutes of Gore Mt. spread throughout the Town of Johnsburg in the various hamlets. Nearby Chestertown, Indian Lake and Warrensburg also provide opportunities and are each about 15 miles away. Further are Lake George, Queensbury, and Glens Falls all about 40-45 minutes away (36 miles). On the NYSEF website under GORE (nysef.org) you will find a list of the area lodging links.

Local eateries provide some great meals. At the Copperfield Inn, a sponsor of the JI & II Finals, you will find **Trappers' Tavern** and **Lourenzo's Al Forno**. In the village of North Creek along Main Street, you will find, **Marsha's Family Restaurant**, **Common Roots**, **Sarah's Café**, **Pete's Aah Pizza**, **Bar Vino**, a wine bar with tapas, **Laura's Bar and Restaurant**, and **Andie's at Smith's Restaurant**. Along Peaceful Valley Rd., ½ mile south of the Gore Mt. access road, is **The Inn on Gore Mt.** and four miles, at the junction with Rt. 8, is the **Black Mt. Resort**. Both serve good food and have a bar. Beyond Black Mt. Lodge, south on Rt. 8 in the hamlet of Johnsburg, the **Johnsburg Market** makes excellent subs, pizza, and a few hot dishes for take-out. Heading north on Rt. 28, up in North River, at the very end of 13th Lake Road, you'll find **Garnet Hill Lodge**, another excellent eatery.

Outside of the town of Johnsburg, east on Rt. 8 (6-12 miles) you'll find the **Alp Horn**, **The Place** (Italian), and **OP Frederick's**. If you want an exquisite dining experience, head either to **Lourenzo's at the Copperfield** in North Creek or to Olmstedville via Rt. 28N out of North Creek and find **The Owl at Twilight**.
